

## £2m to curb anti-social problems

A civic pride officer in a seaside town and "head cams" for police working on the railways are among projects backed by a £2m funding package.

The Welsh Assembly Government money is aimed at tackling anti-social behaviour and litter problems in communities.

**Ceredigion Council receives £50,000 for the civic pride officer**, whose work will involve encouraging students in Aberystwyth to behave responsibly.

Arriva Trains Wales receive £18,000 for strap-on cameras for support officers. Graffiti, litter, dog-fouling and "general untidiness" will be tackled in Denbighshire, while **North Wales Police receives £10,000 to help reduce anti-social behaviour.** Head-cams have been trailed by some police forces in England & NWPF in Deeside
