Meet the cut out policemen!

The brand new way to stop anti-social behaviour

Cardboard cut-out police are to be pieced at crime hotspots in a bid to cut down on anti-socio behaviour.

CARDBOARD police are to watch over crime hotspots in Flintshire.

The county's community safety officer, PC Hazel Goss MBE, came up with the idea of getting life-sized cut-outs of herself made, which can be stood in crime hotspots in a bid to make would-be criminals think twice and to warn the public of crimes in that area.

The cut-outs will have messages attached to them referring to the kinds of crime often committed in that spot. PC Goss said: "I am looking at putting the cut-outs in public places such as leisure centres, supermarkets, schools and other crime hotspot areas.

"As the cut-out stands out so much, it catches your eye straight away. You are then prompted by the crime message, which makes you think twice and reminds you not to leave items on show in your car, or leave your hand bag on your shopping trolley.

"Just having posters around public and private places does not always work so having something as visual as this keeps you on your toes and more alert.

"If this is successful then I will be looking at creating more and using local community beat managers on the cut-outs in areas which they

patrol."
