

Crackdown on criminal damage in Bangor

Police in Bangor are warning people to be on their guard against criminals intent on causing damage.

Since the beginning of April there has been a 30% increase in the number of offences of criminal damage being reported to officers compared to the same period last year, with over 450 crimes being committed.

Damage has included vandalism and graffiti in and around the Bangor area and police are warning that action will be taken against the perpetrators.

District Inspector Richard Green said: "The vast majority of these offences are completely mindless and serve no purpose whatsoever for the offender. The number of offences being committed gives rise to concern, due to their volume. Patrols have increased in some identified areas. However, I would ask that the public be vigilant and report such offences to the police. In addition to this, I would also request that the public support the police in prosecuting those persons found responsible."

He added: "I intend to take a tougher stance against offenders, given that these offences cause a great deal of upset to victims. I also want the public of Bangor to feel reassured that positive measures are being taken to bring those persons found responsible to justice."
