

Data on thousands of criminals lost

The Home Office has admitted offender information has been lost. Personal details relating to thousands of criminals have been lost in the latest in a line of Government data blunders.

The Home Office said a computer memory stick containing information on around **10,000 prolific offenders** had been lost by a contractor.

PA Consulting warned the department on Monday that the stick - which also contains **data on all 84,000 prisoners in England and Wales** - might be lost. And the Home Office admitted
