POLICE PERFORMANCE IMPROVEMENTS HELD BACK BY RED TAPE

COMMENTING after the publication by the Home Office of police performance assessments 2006/2007, Shadow Secretary of State for Wales Cheryl Gillan MP *said*:

"While there are some encouraging signs about the performance of Welsh police forces it is clear from these figures that there is still much work to be done.

"Police officers across Wales are doing a fantastic job but are being hamstrung by Government targets, red tape and form filling.

"Forces across Wales are still counting the cost of the Government's botched merger plans which were rightly ditched in the face of widespread opposition.

"The public will be concerned that despite all the Government rhetoric about cutting bureaucracy the amount of time police spend on the front line remains stagnant.

"Conservatives will make our police accountable to local communities so that police priorities reflect those of the communities they serve.

"That is why we are committed to introducing directly elected police commissioners – accountable first and foremost to local people, not central government.

"That is why we would scrap the stop and search forms to allow officers to stop and question an individual without making a written record.

"And that is why we are committed to improved training for officers.

"The way to drive up standards in our police forces is to free officers from endless form filling and pointless bureaucracy."
