

Road safety in North Wales ... THE TERRIBLE FACTS

In 2007 there were 37 fatal collisions on North Wales roads – a slight drop from 45 in 2006 There have been four fatal crashes so far in 2008.

The number of people killed or seriously injured on the region's roads has steadily increased from 242 in 2005, to 270 in 2006, and up to 304 last year. That is an increase of 26% in just two years.

The worst month for road deaths last year was October – when 12 people lost their lives, several in motorbike collisions.

There were a total 12 fatal collisions in the five months between April and September 2007.

Of the 180 people killed on Welsh roads in 2005, 38% were between 16 and 25 – leading police to pledge they would target younger drivers for better training and education.

All but one of the last three weeks' victims were aged under 30.
