

MINISTERS are considering using cash from speed camera fines to help victims of road accidents

The network of 5,600 cameras in England and Wales rakes in £115 million a year in fines. And campaigners want some of the money to be used to help fund charities working with the victims of road crashes.

A senior Whitehall source said: "It's early days, but it's an idea we're looking at. Some motorists resent paying speed camera fines. But if they knew some of the cash was going to the accident victims, it might change their views." (Really!)

The plan follows a spate of attacks by irate motorists on speed cameras. Some have been pulled down and others have had paint sprayed over the lens to prevent speeding motorists being caught on film.
